



Al Conover, Geoff Seabrook and Charles Kimball promoted to new executive posts

C. ALLAN CONOVER has been named president of the Memorex Communications Group reporting to **DR. JAMES CASTLE**, executive vice president.

Previously vice president for Planning and Program Management, Conover joined Memorex in November 1980 after some 20 years in the data processing industry with Honeywell Information Systems, Inc. and General Electric Company.

Conover plans to "...expand. We need more product to keep up with current orders and to meet the growing worldwide demand for our products. Also, we will evolve our current product line through continuous enhancements," he says. "The opportunities are significant in the Communications Group. Memorex International strategic plans show that 60 percent of its revenue will be derived from Communications Group products."

Conover earned a BS in electrical engineering from Lafayette College in Easton, Pennsylvania, and graduated from Dartmouth's Executive Program at the Tuck School of Business.

Succeeding Conover as vice president of Planning and Program Management is **GEOFFREY S. SEABROOK**, formerly

director of marketing for the Memorex Storage Equipment business.

Seabrook joined Memorex in 1982 from Memorex International in London, where he spent four years as program manager for large disc products. Prior to the acquisition of the international Telex base by Memorex, Seabrook was with Telex Corporation in London for two years and co-founded Aardvark Computers.

Kimball

CHARLES KIMBALL has been appointed vice president and general manager of the Computer Tape Division, reporting to **TOM STEVENS**, president of the Media Products Group. Kimball joined Memorex in December 1981 as manufacturing manager for the Flexible Disc Media Division and has held that position until his recent promotion.

"The first thing I'll do is get a thorough understanding of what are the current business plans and strategic plans of the Division, then identify available resources and needs so I can assist in accomplishing those goals," says Kimball. "I expect my biggest challenge will be to manage the Division so we can react to ever-changing market demands for our products."

Kimball holds a B.S. degree from the Missouri School of Mines and Metallurgy in electrical engineering and has done coursework toward a master's in operations research from the University of Missouri.

Abrahamson and Burns qualify for Olympic Games!

ART BURNS and **DON ABRAHAMSON**, both Memorex employees, have qualified to compete in the 1984 Olympic Games in L.A. this summer.

Burns threw a discus 215 feet to qualify as one of three Americans in that event. He has previously thrown well over 225 feet and will attempt the best throw of his career to bring home a gold medal.

Abrahamson lifted a total of 282.5 kilograms (almost 617 pounds) in two lifts, the snatch and clean & jerk, to qualify in the lightweight category of weightlifters. He weighs only 148 pounds. According to a recent article in the San Jose Mercury, Abrahamson received more applause from the audience than any lifter

Memorex employee wins fourth largest award in history of Burroughs' ESP

For 15 years, **MARTHA KNUTZ** has dreamed of taking a cruise up the coast of Canada and Alaska. "It's supposed to be the most beautiful cruise in the world," says Martha.

But as the mother of three daughters (Debra, Sandra, and Pamela), money for a cruise was simply not in the budget. Then, two years ago, Martha and her then-new husband Glenn learned that Glenn's son Alan would be stationed in Alaska for a four-year hitch with the U.S. Air Force.

"We promised we'd go up there and visit him sometime during his hitch, but we still didn't have the money and didn't know where we'd get it," she says.

Funny how dreams come true, especially when you've won more than \$30,000, the fourth largest award in the history of Burroughs' Employee Suggestion Program and the largest Memorex award to date.

Martha was recently presented with a check for \$3,076 which represents about 10 percent of her anticipated total award amount of over \$30,000. She will receive the remainder of the award after final savings to the Company are calculated at the end of the year.

When she came to Memorex in November 1978, Martha found herself on a production line near LDDD's servo arm assembly area. When she could, Martha watched the lady near her assemble servo arms and was fascinated. It looked more interesting to her than what she was doing. So, when Memorex phased out servo arm assembly about six months later, Martha suggested a rework area for the vendor-supplied arms to ensure they would meet Memorex's high quality standards. Since then, she has been in Rework and still finds it fascinating.


In her job as lead in the 3650/52 Head/Arm Rework Area, Martha recently made a suggestion to use the same glue on the solder pads of the 3650X, 3652Y and servo arms as that used to bond the printed circuit cable to the arm. Implementation of her clever suggestion keeps the solder pads from lifting (and from being scrapped) during rework with hot soldering irons and is saving the Company a large amount of money.

"Since I've been in this area for five years now, it wasn't too difficult to see ways we could be saving money," she says. Her first and only suggestion submitted to the Employee Suggestion Program is the one that netted her the big award from Burroughs.

Her daughters love to brag about Mom. Says Martha, "Even when we go camping, they want me to tell perfect

strangers about my award. They're really proud of me," No wonder.

Martha and Glenn will be cruising up the coast of Canada to Alaska in the Fall of '85. Bon voyage.

BETTY KRIEGER has needed a new engine in her family's '77 Dodge Van for a long time and now they'll get that new engine. She and her husband Keith have dreamed for years of putting a down payment on some property near San Luis Obispo so they can eventually retire there. Now that Betty's a big winner in

the Burroughs Employee Suggestion Program, she and Keith can start looking around for that piece of property.

An assembler in the Thin Film Flex Assembly Production Area in LDDD, Betty suggested combining two steps used in epoxy bonding of the 3680 slider to the loadbeam. Her astute suggestion represents a savings to the Company, a percentage of which has been awarded to Betty in a check for \$2,500, the first installment in her anticipated total award of \$3,938.

If it sounds simple, the way Betty's dreams are coming true, it is. It's as simple as making a suggestion to the Company about ways we can save money, then sharing in the net savings from your suggestion.

By June 1, the one-year anniversary of the program at Memorex, 494 suggestions were received from LDDD employees. Of those, 100 have been adopted and the employees making the adopted suggestions are making their personal dreams come true from their share of the savings to the Company. Over \$37,000 has been paid out to LDDD employees alone for their money-saving ideas in just one year.

Energy conservation results

The Energy Conservation Program is in full swing at Memorex and is especially apparent in Flex Disc, RMCD, Physical Distribution, and Memorex DIC. While the average monthly percent reduction for all facilities is 3.1%, employees in some areas have reduced energy consumption by a great deal more than that. Savings for the first four months of 1984 total \$31,500. Top energy savers for that period and their average monthly percent reductions are:

ERT provides help for emergencies

The Memorex Emergency Response Team (ERT) provides initial response and control at the scene of any emergency on Memorex property in the Santa Clara Valley. Its primary mission is to provide emergency services above and beyond the call of their regular job responsibilities at Memorex with the safety of employees as their highest priority.

During the course of an emergency, ERT members have the ability and authority to direct:

- emergency care of the sick and injured
- first aid
- firefighting, including containment (not structural)
- use of fire extinguishers, automatic sprinkler systems and communication equipment.

On arrival of ambulance, fire or law enforcement personnel, the ERT member coordinates or administers first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), use of a fire extinguisher, evacuation, hazard material handling, and spill control.

ERT members are all volunteers and trained by Memorex a total of 16 hours in CPR and first aid, and additional hours in emergency response techniques.

ERT members in one division of Memorex recently applied their training in response to a very ill employee who was doubled up in pain from what was later determined to be rapid internal bleeding.

An ERT member, who is also a Human Resources representative, was alerted that an employee in the division was in severe pain. The ERT member went to the scene immediately, then called a Memorex nurse. While the nurse appraised the victim's condition and ordered an ambulance to the scene, the ERT member went immediately to the parking lot to ensure that nothing would block the ambulance. As it turned out, a large truck was in the driveway where the ambulance — which was already on the way — would be pulling in. The ERT member then summoned another trained ERT member who had the truck removed, just in time for the ambulance. The victim was taken to the hospital for immediate treatment.

Because of the nature of the emergency and the possible consequences, responses of the ERT members and the Memorex nurse were truly critical to the timely treatment of the victim. This is just one of many instances where ERT training paid off at Memorex.

In case of any emergency, employees are required to dial extension 7-3333. That line is picked up by Security, Safety, Health Services, and Facilities. ERT members are summoned to the scene of the emergency at that time.

Memorex Security officers set record for length of service with Company

Memorex Security recently celebrated what is believed to be a "first" in the contract security industry.

On June 11, eight California Plant Protection officers became eligible for five-year service pins. The uniqueness of this is that all of their service time was at Memorex Corporation in Santa Clara. While many Plant Protection officers achieve five or more years of service, it is unusual for the entire term to be served at one user firm and research indicates that Memorex is the first user firm to have as many as eight security officers celebrating five years of service.

The eight officers honored are: **JIM EVANS, AMOS HARRIS, JACK HEUSCHOBER, RICH MINUCCIANI, ANDRE POLIZZI, FRED RAARUP, and RUBY WASHINGTON.** **LARRY WILLIAMS** was also honored but not present at the ceremonies.

JOHN BLACKBURN, Corporate Security manager at Memorex, has an idea why Plant Protection officers tend to stay at Memorex, "We're a fair employer. We treat them right. We try to motivate them and treat them with respect and dignity."

Traveling from Van Nuys to present the five-year pins was **TOM WATHEN**, president of California Plant Protection who said, "It was truly a first for me and the company to award that many five-year pins to any group of officers, must less all from one location. The occasion reflects great credit on

Memorex management. Obviously, those officers feel very loyal and comfortable working in the environment that you have created."

Blackburn also presented the Memorex Security department's coveted Key Award to all eight officers while **LARRY CHAMBERLIN**, vice president of Human Resources and Corporate Communications, presented them with identification badges bearing five-year designators.

Other California Plant Protection officials present were **GORDON MILLS**, executive vice president; **RON HUNT**, vice president; and **LARRY TAYLOR**, regional manager. Representing Memorex were **LEIGH MATEAS**, manager of Human Resources Corporate Services; **LES HOWARD**, manager of Plant Protection; and **RON PRICE** and **BERT WORTHINGTON**, Security Department supervisors.

For the third consecutive year, Memorex Corporation is sponsoring exchange students from European universities who are or will be working in various areas of the Company for the summer.



Product profiles...

The 3.5-inch microfloppy, one of three sizes competing for domination of the microfloppy marketplace, is currently experiencing a wave of industry acceptance. Several computer manufacturers, including Apple, Hewlett-Packard, Gavilan, and Interdec, have adopted the 3.5-inch disc for use in their desktop computers. To meet that demand, Memorex is expanding shipment of the new 3.5-inch (single-sided) microfloppy to include all of the Company's computer media marketing channels. The tiny disc stores up to 500 kilobytes of information in the single-sided format. Future high-density vertical recording technology may enable the microfloppy to store from 1.5 megabytes to 5 megabytes, according to **CHUCK COMISO**, vice president of Marketing and Sales for the Media Products Group...Memorex is also shipping engineering evaluation samples of a *double-sided*, 3.5-inch microfloppy and plans for full-scale production of the new disc this Fall. The double-sided disc stores up to 1 megabyte (unformatted) or the equivalent of about 120 typewritten pages. "Early indications are that there is already a strong interest in the double-sided microfloppy," noted Comiso...Memorex is now offering a 1,200 lines-per-minute (lpm) impact printer which is plug-compatible with the 3203-5 printer. The Memorex® 4303 printer uses half the power and space of the 3203-5, provides high quality printout on one- to six-part forms, and is sound-insulated for extraordinarily quiet operation. The 4303 uses only 1100 watts of power in full operation and comes in a space-saving cabinet at 35 inches wide, 53 inches deep and 49 inches high. In addition to the standard 1,200 lpm configuration, the 4303 will also be available in a 1,500 lpm model.

History at Memorex: Came in July 1964 as a certifier operator in the Tape plant; has since worked in Disc Pack, Consumer Products, and now in LDDD, inspecting IC's and transistors in Receiving Inspection. Since the implementation of the quality program at Memorex, including higher standards for vendor-supplied parts, "...the vendor-supplied parts are better quality, much better," she says.

Personal History: Raised in San Jose, her father was a sharecropper. Rebecca (Becky to her friends) earned spending money as a young girl by picking beans in a large bean field in San Jose, now the site of the Red Lion Inn. 
