S&I Plan Weathers Market Decline



As indicated in the May **Update**, recent stock price fluctuations have intensified Savings and Investment Plan members' interest in the action of the securities markets—and in particular, Memorex common stock and convertible debentures.

In the last week of May stock prices rebounded sharply from the eight year lows they had reached several days earlier. The large gains made by a great many issues were reflected by the Dow Jones Industrial Average's increase of better than 10 percent. Although the sudden surge in prices has strengthened investor confidence, many market observers question whether these new price levels can be sustained. The circumstances which presumably contributed to the market decline have not disappeared, yet many feel the outlook for these points of concern,

like the softening of the economy and the Indochina situation, shows signs of improving by year end.

The Savings and Investment Plan has managed to weather the unsettled market conditions fairly well. From the inception of the Plan in January of this year through the end of May, the Trust has purchased 3,600 shares of Memorex common stock at an average cost per share of \$100.30. In May purchases of common stock were made at prices from \$65 to \$82 per share. To lessen the impact of sharp downward price movements on the asset value of the Trust, the Trust has also purchased 70 Memorex Convertible bonds at an average price of \$880. Fifty bonds were bought in May at prices ranging from \$830 to \$910 per bond.


